


 Remove shade from installation brackets using a flathead screwdriver. Insert tip of screwdriver between the back of the headrail and the bracket.

3. Unscrew the top joiner ball. Set aside danskord (thick rope cord). Untie joiner ball knot. Remove joiner ball and washer



19. Feed the cord through the cord lock, making sure the cord is between the silver rivet and the roller in the cord lock.





23. Replace top joiner ball and washer. Trim cords to same length if necessary. Tie knot in end of cord.


